Deeply informed by Anne Frank's remarkable and beloved *Diary*, as well as the eternal reverberations of the Holocaust, this carefully cultivated performance incorporates compositions by Gustav Mahler, Leo Smit, Michael Cohen, Harry Burleigh, and Pittsburgh composer Douglas Levine's musical setting of Maya Angelou's poem *Alone*.

A dessert reception with the performers follows the concert. Complimentary shuttle service will be available from the Carnegie Municipal Lot on Main Street (between Mary and Pine Streets).

Tickets are \$15 in advance, \$20 at the door, and \$5 for students.
